Spring is upon us....not that you would notice!

Well the winter period could have been worse as we escaped snow of any note, however we did not escape the rain and cold spells, which unfortunately appeared to regularly happen on market days.

Since Christmas its pleasing to see that CC Viyella is now staying in town after having signed a new lease and that we have welcomed two new independent businesses with Mold Alehouse and Yarn O'Clock in Earl Road and a third, The Olive Tree Deli and Winery due to open in Upper High Street in the near future.

Mold Spring Clean was a great success with over 700 participants this year and more business than ever participating in some way. Springy, the Spring Clean mascot was out and about over the weekend, ensuring the young (and young at heart), received the message about how important it is to look after our town.

The town centre visitor infrastructure projects are progressing well and most of the new town signage has been installed (and redundant clutter removed), New Street car park works are well underway , the new street lighting is being installed shortly and the design of the new town gateway signs and additional Visitor Information Points are due to be completed shortly. The Town Council Community Development and Regeneration committee has also agreed for most of the town's footpaths to receive a refresh with a black slurry seal, which will overcome the "patchwork" of red / black / grey / etc mess we currently have. Funding for these works has come from car park revenues generated for 15 months before the County Council implemented parking charges across the rest of the Flintshire and then decided to also keep the additional revenues from Mold – apart from a small financial gesture!

The town events calendar will hopefully bring visitors to the town from near and far – a copy is attached but if you haven't received one please call in at the Town Council Offices in Mold Town Hall.

Flintshire Against Business Crime

A significant community safety initiative is coming to Mold in the next couple of months. The County Council working with North Wales Police are introducing '*Flintshire Against Business Crime*' which is a development of the highly successful Chester Against Business Crime initiative that has been operating to great acclaim for many years.

Businesses that sign up for the scheme get dedicated personnel who look to deter and then assist in keeping prolific criminals at bay from shoplifting, anti-social behaviour and other forms of stock loss and criminal activity.

Scheme members get access to a secure website where latest intelligence and photographs of offenders are shared amongst retailers, pubs and clubs, CCTV, Police and other community safety professionals. They also get the latest digital radio with clear and reliable communications between themselves, CCTV control and the Police.

Regular briefing events (similar to the current Shopwatch scheme) are held when intelligence is shared, relevant issues discussed and banning orders agreed for prolific local offenders.

Shopwatch in Mold has had some notable success however the infrastructure and support is not as professional as it could and should be and the radios are now well past their best and the network is due to be switched off in coming months, therefore Mold's retail and hospitality community need to make the most of this great opportunity to jointly address these important issues affecting Mold's ongoing attractiveness. There is obviously a cost, but it is being kept to an absolute minimum and is based on the size of the premises involved. The initiative is also receiving grant funding from the County Council and resource support from North Wales Police.
