Festive period...started slow with the bad weather!

Having now spoken with many different traders from across the town, the overall opinion of trade over the festive period has been "Not too bad and it could have been worse". Many shops did well, although a number have indicated they struggled, however, overall Mold still appears to be still holding its own.

Work is now underway to improve the signage into and within the town, using funding that only became available when we were able to create a town investment fund from the car park charges which had to be used for visitor infrastructure projects. The County Council have unfortunately withdrawn most of this funding for Mold as they introduced car parking charges across the County although the town still contributes more than anywhere else into the Flintshire County Council pot. Other initiatives using the same funding includes the well received Visitor Information points, new town gateways, updated town map, makeover of New Street car park, a dedicated "Mold" street cleaning machine, new and additional street lighting with the balance going towards footpath improvements.

Many will be aware that at long last, Business Rates are being reviewed across North Wales and the results are emerging, although the specifics will not become public until after approval by Welsh Government. I've managed to secure a visit to the town, by the principle Valuation Officer for North Wales with the VOA, who will explain what the future holds for Mold and the region at a special Mold Business Forum Traders group in Mold Town Hall. I hope as many businesses as possible will be able to attend to find out the latest developments in this important aspect of trading in the town and share their views on this and other important issues.

Mold Traders Group Meeting – Changes to your Business Rates (5.30pm Thursday 18th February 2016 at Mold Town Hall)

Mold Town Council has agreed to host a meeting at **Mold Town Hall at 5.30pm, Thursday 18th February** of Mold Business Forum Traders Group to discover details on the recent Business Rates review for Mold.

This event is open to ALL Traders and businesses in Mold whether they are national, regional or independent; retail, service sector or hospitality and is an opportunity for Businesses to gain updates, share concerns, and explore joint initiatives that will help them in Mold to move forward.

Seven years have now elapsed since the last review of Business Rates and Welsh Government has now commissioned a review of Business Rates across Wales via the Valuation Office Agency. The VOA has now completed Mold in respect of Shops and is part way through looking at office space and business / industrial parks. Mr Richie Roberts, the Chief Valuer for Wales, has agreed to come to Mold on the above date to inform traders of findings to date and recommendations arising from the review. He will not be in a position to examine details on specific cases, but will be able to provide an early insight into what is happening and the direction business owners can expect this important business cost to take. A Q&A opportunity will be available.
